

Saints Rest Floral & Cleanup Regulations - Sign Posting

In case you are not aware or have forgotten Cemetery Regulations, a sign will soon be posted near the Cemetery entrance. Please help us maintain the beauty of the Cemetery. The sign will be a reminder of:

- Floral arrangements and wreaths may be placed at the cemetery at any time throughout the year. However, flowers placed at grave sites the end of March thru November are recommended to be placed in vases or urns to prevent damage by grounds maintenance.
- A complete cleanup will be conducted by the Cemetery Ministry in the Spring prior to Mother's Day (on/about May 1st).
- Periodic follow-on cleanup will be conducted by the Cemetery Ministry after Memorial Day thru October.
- For the safety of all visitors, floral arrangements should NEVER be placed in glass receptacles.

Old Saints Rest Cemetery Update

The Saints Rest Cemetery Ministry have been working diligently to obtain funding to assist in the total cleanup and restoration of the Old Cemetery. This endeavor will not be a simple nor expeditious one. However, we are determined to make a difference. In coordination with some local organizations, we have begun the first phase of the cleanup. We are hopeful that more extensive cleanup will begin soon.

Since many of the graves are unmarked, your assistance is needed to help identify those buried in the Old Cemetery. If you have family members buried in the Old Cemetery and haven't had the opportunity to fill out our Cemetery Occupancy Survey, please contact Rosetta Holloway, Burial Coordinator or Wanda Eldridge, St. Mark History & Archives.

Current Rates

- \$2,000/grave (St. Mark members)
- \$3,000/grave (Non-St. Mark members)
- \$1,600 Opening/Closing
- \$1,000 Vault

Payments

If you have reserved grave sites that have **NOT** been paid-in-full, within two years of your initial contract; please contact Mrs. Theresa Hebron **IMMEDIATELY**. Failure to do so could result in the forfeiture of monies paid and loss of the grave site.

Permanent Markers

• Contact the Cemetery Ministry prior to selection of a permanent marker to ensure your selection is approved for the appropriate section of the Cemetery.

• Markers can be placed on the grave site six months to one year following burial. Contact Cemetery Ministry prior to the six-month timeframe to ensure the grave site has properly settled.

• Contact the Cemetery Ministry prior to scheduling installation to ensure a Ministry rep will be available on-site during installation.
