Tribute, Reflection, Tradition



2021 RATE INCREASES

Effective June 1, 2021, the following rates apply:

- \$2,000/grave (St. Mark members)
- \$3,000/grave (Non-St. Mark member)
- \$1,600—Opening/Closing
- \$800—Vault

If you have reserved gravesites that have NOT been paid in full, within three years of your initial contract; please contact Mrs. Theresa Hebron immediately. Failure to do so could result in forfeiture of deposit and loss of gravesite.

We continue to investigate ways to assist those interested in purchasing graves at Saints Rest. Therefore, COMING SOON we plan to offer an Automatic payment option.

Floral & Memorial Decoration Policy

Floral Arrangements

- Floral arrangements and wreaths may be placed at the cemetery at any time throughout the year. However, flowers placed at gravesites the end of March thru November are recommended to be placed in vases or urns to prevent damage by grounds maintenance.
- A complete cleanup will be conducted by the Cemetery Ministry in the Spring prior to Mother's Day (on/about May 1st).
- Periodic follow-on cleanup will be conducted by the Cemetery Ministry after Memorial Day thru October.
- For the safety of all visitors, floral arrangements should NEVER be placed in glass receptacles.
- Christmas flowers, wreaths and winter grave decorations may be placed anytime after the Friday before Thanksgiving and will not be removed by the Cemetery Ministry until the Spring cleanup.

Funeral Arrangements

- Funeral flowers and arrangements will be removed one week following the funeral service, or as deemed necessary to ensure safety of visitors or to avoid hindrance of cemetery operations (e.g., grounds maintenance, burial, etc.)
- Families wishing to keep funeral flowers are advised and encouraged to retrieve them from the gravesite before leaving the cemetery.

Flags

- Individual flags (not exceeding 19" h x 17" w) may be placed directly on the gravesite, 1" from the headstone, during Memorial Day, Flag Day, Armed Forces Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.
- The Cemetery Ministry shall have, and reserves the right of removal and disposal of individual flags that may have been displayed.
- Families wishing to retain their flag must remove it within three weeks after the scheduled holiday.
- The Cemetery is NOT responsible for loss or damage to flags placed on gravesites.

Permanent Markers

- Contact the Cemetery Ministry prior to selection of a permanent marker to ensure your selection is approved for the appropriate section of the Cemetery.
- Markers can be placed on the gravesite six months to one year following burial. Contact Cemetery Ministry prior to the six-month timeframe to ensure the gravesite has properly settled.
- Contact the Cemetery Ministry prior to scheduling installation to ensure a Ministry rep will be available onsite during installation.

Prohibited Items

- Decorations of the Cemetery landscape (e.g., trees, shrubs, statues, etc.)
- Decorative fencing around gravesites or trenching of grass to outline boundaries.
- Use of flowers, garland or other items to outline the boundaries.
- No additional monuments other than headstone or memorial markers.
- Standing/Inflatable decorations (e.g., Balloons, Santa Claus, Snowmen, Candy Canes, Easter Bunnies, Eggs, Baskets, etc.)
- Artificial grass
- Battery operated items
- Artificial lighting fixtures
- Glass floral receptacles
